From the Pastor's Study...

"The Default Option"

The hardware that runs our world baffles me. How computers, phones, and iPads work have always been a mystery. I am as far from a computer engineer as it is possible for one to be.

Over time, I've become more adept at handling other parts of that world, such as the nomenclature. When we got a desk top computer, the first time I heard the term "mouse," I probably looked at the floor for a rodent.

"Default" was another confusing term. When you first hear the word, it sounds like you've done something wrong; it's the "-fault" part of it. But I soon realized the word was used in a different way: If you don't choose an option, for example, there's a "default" option that the computer, phone, or iPad will choose for you. Failing to make a choice is still making a choice.

This time of year is a good time to consider your default choice. September 11th is upon us, and I think it's important for us to have a default in place of tolerance, acceptance, and peace. Just this morning, for example, Baptist News Global had a story about a restaurant one minister in New York was in when a woman started screaming obscenities and making accusations against people that looked different—and all the patrons sat and watched. Their default option was to ignore what they saw. Only he got up to intercede, and is worried that far too many people in these charged days are making that same choice—just accepting this kind of behavior is a default choice; it's just the wrong one.

Fall is coming, and with it Thanksgiving and Christmas. If there are ever days for us to find fault with other family members, it's likely around those two holidays. You're basically shut up inside with people you may not be around often and tempers are loosened by "beverages," as my son-in-law likes to say (he's from Minnesota, so "drunk as a skunk" is not a term he's familiar with yet!).

In times like these, let's make a real, conscious effort to choose a default option that looks like the gospel writer John and his interpretation of Jesus: *"For this is the message that you have heard from the beginning, that we should love one another....Whoever does not love abides* [meaning, lives] *in death,"* and finishes with, *"let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action."* Not a passive, but an active, kind of love.

Choose your default option now: When you have to make a choice, make it love.

FINANCIAL TIP - WHAT IS QCD?

Perhaps you have never heard of it, but a QCD is a Qualified Charitable Distribution. The use of a QCD may be beneficial to you, if you are no longer itemizing deductions on your federal income taxes.

A QCD allows taxpayers, age 70 ¹/₂ or older who are required to take RMDs (Required Minimum Distributions), to donate from a traditional IRA to an eligible charity without that amount being subject to federal tax. Of course there are specific rules and procedures to follow and you should work with your IRA custodian and tax preparer to do it correctly.
