From the Pastor's Study...

One of the first things I do most mornings is let out our dog Max. One day recently I opened the door a little later than usual, so the sun was already doing its thing: it was bright and clear, and warmer, a beautiful day in the making. But what struck me immediately was the sound, the sound of what sounded like dozens of birds singing their morning songs. The sound meant something had changed. It was a symphony announcing that a very welcome new day had come: the sound of spring.

On his last ride into Jerusalem on the colt, or donkey (depending on which account you read), Jesus heard an unfamiliar sound, too, the sound of probably dozens of voices playing an impromptu welcome. They climbed up a fairly steep incline to what was known as the Lions Gate (later also called St. Stephen's Gate) on the east side of the city.

At the same time, on the western side through Jaffa Gate, people heard the sound of trumpets as Pilate entered from his seaside hideaway with a retinue of soldiers to enforce order during the Passover celebration. It would be a clash worthy of a thousand Hollywood big screen productions that would change the world forever.

The events of the following week turned him from a prophet and holy man into a healer and savior of humanity. Even with the money changers' tables, the retreat through Lions Gate again to the Mount of Olives and Gethsemane, the betrayal and arrest, the crucifixion would have marked just another end—just another criminal that got Roman "justice" so their exploitation of the Land of David could continue uninterrupted.

Theologian James Cone called it the most famous lynching in history. He was right. But describing it that way also highlights the fact that black Friday was not that unique. What made these events different wasn't the lynching "on a tree," as the spiritual goes.

What altered our world forever was Sunday morning. The sounds that day heralded something new, too: "He is not here....he has risen," the pounding of running to tell the news to his followers, the excited and even fearful voices sharing news they could not comprehend....

Even now we can scarcely comprehend it. Yet that morning altered your life, and every life, from that day forward and forever.

What a welcome sound.
