Volunteers are needed to help with the drive.


At last count, 36 people have signed up to donate blood; but, we still need volunteers to assist the Red Cross team.

Note: If you are a regular donor, there is a 60 day wait time between donations so please plan accordingly.



STEPS for signing up:


- 1. Go to redcrossblood.org
- 2. Enter 23024 in "find a blood drive". Click blue arrow
- 3. Select "By Distance" tab



5. Choose your time. "Blood" is a traditional donation. "Power Red" is similar to a whole blood donation, except a special machine is used to allow you to safely donate two units of red blood cells during one donation while returning your plasma and platelets to you. It takes about 30 minutes longer than a normal donation.



4. Select "See Times" next to Elk Creek Baptist Church





6. Then you either sign in, or create an account if you haven't done this before. The steps are straight forward.



Christmas (season) isn't over yet! There are still the "12 days of Christmas".

All singing aside, there actually *is* a historical basis for the traditional Christmas carol we all know and love. Christians have historically celebrated a period of 12 days surrounding Christmas. The nearly two-week time period starts and ends with two pretty significant holidays: Christmas on Dec. 25, and the Epiphany on Jan. 6.

Meaning of Each Gifts



A Partridge in a Pear Tree - Jesus, the Son of God. (Note: A mother partridge is the only bird that will die to protect its young.

Two Turtledoves - the Old and New Testaments, the complete story of the Christian faith and God's plan for the world.

Three French Hens - faith, hope, and love (1 Corinthians 13, the love chapter)

Four Calling Birds - the four Gospels — Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

Five Gold Rings - the first five books of the Old Testament, known as the Pentateuch.

Six Geese a-Laying - the first story found in the Bible; each egg is a day in creation, a time when the world was "hatched" or formed by God.

Seven Swans a-Swimming - the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: prophecy, ministry, teaching, exhortation, giving, leading, and compassion. As swans are one of the most beautiful and graceful creatures on earth, they would seem to be a perfect symbol for the spiritual gifts.

Eight Maids-a-Milking - Being a milkmaid was about the worst job one could have in England during this period; this code conveyed that Jesus cared as much about servants as he did those of royal blood. The eight who were blessed included the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, and those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake.

Nine Ladies Dancing - the fruits of the Spirit - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Ten Lords a-leaping - As lords were judges and in charge of the law, these stood for the Ten Commandments

Eleven Pipers Piping - the disciples, excluding Judas who betrayed Jesus and committed suicide, leaving eleven men who carried out the gospel message.

Twelve Drummers Drumming - the 12 points of doctrine in the Apostles' Creed.

Mission Opportunities through Baptist Goshen Association (BGAV)

• Four-Part Mission Team to Armenia set for August 2023. The Goshen Missions Committee is in the process of planning a Mission Trip to Sisian, Armenia for the dates of August 17-29, 2023. The Team will be working with one of our three church planters, Pastor Vardan and his wife Lusine. We are planning to have four parts to the team: part 1 will be working with children and youth in a Vacation Bible School setting; part 2 will be made up of ladies who will have classes for the local women while the VBS is going on; part 3 will be made up of pastors/ teachers to hold classes for the pastors in the area and doing some outreach around our construction project; and the fourth part will be the construction team to work on a project TBD. The cost of the trip is estimated at \$1800-2000 depending on the cost of airline tickets. Additional funds would be needed for any souvenirs or shopping. The team will be staying in a hotel. There are no special shots required for entry into the country. You will need a current passport. If you would like more information or are interested in being on one of the four parts of this team, please contact the Goshen Ministry Center at 540.894.8440. Please pray the Lord would build this team and Goshen people would be receptive to His calling.

- **Disaster Response Baby Boxes** Part of the BGAV's new disaster response program for supply distribution, Goshen is collecting supplies to fill 240 baby boxes so families can have the essentials to care for their baby during a crisis. This is a brand new idea and Goshen is the first to put together these needed supplies. Plans are to pack boxes in the spring (depending on donations) to be prepared for hurricane season 2023. The boxes (will be provided) are to contain: a tube of Desitin (4 -ounce), 1 pacifier (in packaging), 1 bottle (8-ounce in packaging), 1 blanket, 1 sm. box of disposable diaper sacks or 4 gal trash bags, 3 packs of unscented wipes (50-100 count each), 2 packs of name brand diapers (25-35 depending on size). - Hope for Appalachia (http://hfavateam.com) make "Hope Boxes" for students age 4-18 to be given out with salvation message at schools in Kentucky in the spring and fall. Needs: Hats & Mittens (due by October 1st yearly). Also, fleece blankets (new-if making, should be two 1 1/2 yard pieces tied), clean current style prom dresses (new or used), and Hope Boxes (all due by Feb. 1st each year). POTLUCK!! Here is a cure all for a cold or flu, or whatever else that ails you. Or just feeling cold when the temperatures are in the 30's or below.

RUSSIAN TEA

Ingredients: 1 ½ pts orange juice, 1 c. sugar, 2-3 Tbsp whole cloves, 5 cups water, 2 tea bags

You need 3 containers for this recipe, One large pot and 2 quart size containers.

In the large pot, begin warming:

1 1/2 pints of orange juice (The original recipe called for 1 sm. can of frozen juice mixed with 3 cups of water, but I haven't been able to find these lately.)

In a quart size pot, combine: 1 cup sugar

2 cups water

1/3 can of whole cloves (approx. 2-3 Tbsp)

Boil hard for 2 minutes then strain and discard cloves. Add clove water to orange juice.

In a second quart size pot, boil 3 cups of water. Add 2 Lipton's tea bags and steep for 5 minutes. Add tea to orange juice.

Serve hot. This mixture can be kept warm on the back of the stove for a while. It will keep in the refrigerator for about a week, and can be heated one cup at a time or the whole mixture at once.

An alternative that is good (but not as good as the real thing) if you can still find Tang, and more mobile:

1 (1 lb. 2 oz.) jar Tang	3/4 c. instan
1/2 tsp. ground cloves (I tend to add an extra	1 1/4 c. suga

To prepare mix, combine Tang, sugar, tea, spices and salt. Store in tightly covered container. Makes 4 cups mix or enough for 12 quarts of tea. For 1 quart of Russian Tea, combine 1/2 cup mix with 1 quart of water. (I found 4-6 heaping tsp. makes a nice single cup of tea.)
