Volunteers pack 242 "Baby Boxes"

On the morning of May 20th at the Mineral Baptist Church Family Life Center, nearly 40 volunteers from 9 churches within the Goshen Baptist Association gathered to pack 242 Disaster Response Baby Boxes, containing

baby items generously donated by many churches, church groups, and individuals within the Goshen community.

Virginia Baptist Disaster Response currently have "Mud out" Buckets and non-perishable "Food Boxes", as well as "Hygiene kits" that are distributed during disasters

to people in crisis. Pastor Richard Sandberg ,of Louisa Baptist Church, saw a need for "Baby Boxes" to give to families with infants and toddlers.

Pastor Sandberg has personally lived through several disasters and coordinated disaster relief efforts in Louisiana and Mississippi. After working and ministering through these disasters and getting to know what people need most, Sandberg had the idea to prepare and organ-



ize baby boxes for distribution. The Goshen Missions Committee liked the idea and decided to pilot the development of the "Baby Boxes."

Sandberg also trains people same diaper interested in being disaster size boxes site coordinators with a loaded onto program he developed for the same the BGAV. spot on each

The boxes packed on May 20th were all uniform in size and contained enough supplies for about two weeks: 2 packs of name brand diapers (25-35 diapers per pack) or Pull-Up diapers (17-24 per pack), 3 packs of un-

> scented baby wipes (50-80 in each), 1 new 8 ounce bottle (in packaging), 1 pacifier (sealed in packaging), 1 diaper rash ointment, 1 blanket (prewashed in a baby friendly detergent and sealed in a plastic zipper bag), 1 box of diaper sacks or 4 gallon trash bags, a "Hope" New Testament Bible (purchased from Christianbook.com),

and a "Where is God in our suffering?" pamphlet (also from Christianbook.com). Preemie and Newborn boxes contained 2 prewashed receiving blankets and a 4 or 5 -ounce bottle.

The 15"x12"x10" boxes, purchased from Walmart.com were the ideal size for the items and stacked well onto the pallets. Each pallet had 36 boxes total with 2 boxes of each size diaper or pull-up noted on

the outside label. All pallets were organized to be uniform with the same diaper size boxes loaded onto the same spot on each

The RuraLove Thrift Store is open to the public to purchase clothing and yard sale items on Wednesdays (year-round) and the first Saturday of the month April-November from 8-12:30. In the past month (through your contributions and donations to RuraLove) you have helped local families in crisis by providing:

- 10 Families with financial needs (\$6358.66) (Rent, Mortgage, Utilities)

Total sales from the Thrift Store for clothing and donated yard sale items for the past month: **\$8,778.75**

"A word with Dee"

Healthy Churches Have a Very Positive Culture

One of my favorite books in the past several years is entitled Culture Wins: The Roadmap to an Irresistible Workplace by William Vanderbloemen. The author served as the pastor of a large Presbyterian Church in Texas, and he said that the culture of the church was not very positive at all (he assumes much of the blame for this). So, he

left the church and went to work for a large oil and gas company in Texas. Again, the culture of the workplace left much to be desired. So, William decided to launch his own company (called Vanderbloemen Search Group) which helps to find pastors and staff members for churches throughout the country.

Several years after beginning this new company, "Entrepreneur" magazine selected William's company to receive the "Best Company Culture Award" in the entire country.

Vanderbloemen says that the success of any organization (including a church) is determined by the culture. He goes on to emphasize that "when culture is bad, no matter how talented the team or great the strategy, a team will never reach its potential. Because whether good or bad, culture is the trump card that determines your team's outcome. During my early years, in a different life, I had an incredibly talented team with a good strategy and a bad culture – which was largely my fault. It didn't go well. Why? Because culture always wins" (page xi).

The culture of a church is shaped by the personality, style, and approach of the pastor and the key leaders. Almost all of the time, the culture just happens by "accident." No one in the leadership of the church is intentionally striving to achieve a positive or effective culture. The culture is formed because of the normal behavior of the leaders.

So, there are a variety of steps that church leaders need to take in order to create a healthy and effective church culture:

1. Make a serious and honest attempt to determine the nature of the current church culture (healthy and not-so-healthy).

2. Make a prayerful decision about what kind of church culture God wants you to have.

3. What actions and attitudes need to be displayed in order for the change of culture to take place?

4. Be willing to make significant changes in the programs and activities of the church in order to achieve the desired culture.

5. Remember, your primary goal is to build a, positive, irresistible atmosphere in which the mission of Christ can flourish.

Goshen to Commemorate Religious Liberty

At the Intersection of Constitution Highway and Clifton Road (Orange County) sits a park. It is the Leland-Madison Park which was created to commemorate the meeting of two champions of religious liberty, John Leland and James Madison.

These men met to discuss the upcoming constitutional convention and the desire of those once called "Dissenters" to have safeguards within the new document which would protect their right to worship as they saw fit. The law of England had guaranteed religious toleration to all the people within their lands. But to the Baptists, Quakers, Presbyterians, and others, toleration was often absent in their treatment by the Church and government officials.

A proposal has been made to the Goshen Association that the park be used to celebrate the process of Religious Liberty within Virginia and by extension, the United States. Although the name of the park may not change, the focus would be expanded beyond the one meeting to include information on the people and events that led to the First Amendment. A committee will be formed to carry out this work under the sponsorship of the Goshen Association.

1 blanket (we wash in baby friendly detergent, sealed in a zipper bag & ready to use)
1 sm. box of diaper sacks or 4 gal trash bags
3 packs wipes (unscented 50-100 count each)
2 packs of name brand diapers (25-35 count)
Or 2 marks of Dull Unit transformer (17, 25 count)

Or 2 packs of Pull-Up type diapers (17-25 count) Bring items to Goshen Ministry Center during office hours. For any questions call, 540.894.8440. Funds are welcomed and we will shop for you at \$50 per box. Part of the GMO will provide the boxes, "Hope" New Testaments, and "Where is God in our Suffering?" tract. The next Baby Box packing day is March 9, 2024. ALL items must be delivered to GMC by 1 p.m. on Feb 1, 2024.

We will not be accepting items on packing day.

pallet, which will help those distributing the boxes in a disaster. After stacking and organizing, the 36 boxes were saran wrapped together so as not to shift in transit. The wrapped pallets were then loaded on the BGAV Disaster Response box truck and headed to the storage warehouse, where they will be ready to go to a specific distribution site when our Virginia Baptist Disaster Response Teams receive a call out from the American Red Cross.



When a disaster occurs, one or more of the pallets will be loaded on a box truck or trailer located at the BGAV warehouse and delivered to the staging site with follow-up deliveries made to the site to replenish supplies, as long as needed.

The following churches participated in providing supplies for the 242 boxes: Antioch, Berea, Craigs WMU, Dogwood, Gordonsville, Hebron Baptist Women, Louisa, Mechanicsville, Mineral, Mount Gilead, Oakland, Orange (Kay Culpeper and Carrie Webb Circles), Smyrna, Wallers,
