The RuraLove Thrift Store is open to the public to purchase clothing and yard sale items on Wednesdays (year-round) and the first Saturday of the month April-November from 8-12:30. In the past month (through your contributions and donations to RuraLove) you have helped local families in crisis by providing:

- 24 Families with financial needs (\$8,901.01) (Rent, Mortgage, Utilities)
- 7 Families with household needs
- ♦ 762.5 volunteer hours were donated in July with the average of 10-12 volunteers on Mondays (sorting) and 18-22 volunteers each Wednesday (sale day).

In July volunteers made:

- ♦ 2 delivery of donated items
- ♦ 3 deliveries of purchased items
- ♦ 8 pick ups of donations
- ♦ 482 total miles driven for pick ups and deliveries
- ♦ Received \$222.60 for recycling metal
- ♦ Received \$628 for the past 3 months of recycling unsellable clothing from Planet Aid.

Goshen is continuing to collect supplies for Disaster Response Baby Boxes so families can have the essentials to care for their baby during a crisis. Each box (we provide boxes, New Testaments, and tracts) contains:

a 4 ounce tube of Desitin or store brand version (which is much cheaper)

1 pacifier (sealed in packaging)

1 bottle (8-ounce sealed in packaging)

1 blanket (we wash in baby friendly detergent, sealed in a zipper bag & ready to use)

1 sm. box of diaper sacks or 4 gal trash bags

3 packs wipes (unscented 50-100 count each)

2 packs of name brand diapers (25-35 count)

Or 2 packs of Pull-Up type diapers (17-25 count)

"A word from Dee"

During the Goshen Commissioning Service for the Mission the Presider Team headed for Armenia I shared this story about the power of prayer:

The presider

In his excellent book entitled "If You Want to Walk on Water, You've Got to Get Out of the Boat" John Ortberg tells the true story about Doug Coe who led a Bible study in Washington, D.C. for politicians and power brokers.

A man by the name of Bob made a commitment to Christ through the influence of Doug Coe. This new Christian read the passage in which Jesus said, "Ask whatever you will in my name and you will receive it."

So, Bob decided that he would put God to the test...and he told Doug that he was going to start praying for Africa. Doug advised him to narrow down his focus a little bit...so he decided to pray for one country in Africa...,the country of Kenya.

Doug asked Bob if he knew anyone in Kenya...the answer was "No"

Had he ever traveled to Kenya?...again the answer was "No"

So, Doug made a very unusual arrangement with Bob. He told Bob to pray for Kenya every day for the next 6 months. If Bob would do that...and nothing extraordinary happened, then Doug would give Bob \$500. However, if he prayed for Kenya for 6 months and something miraculous did happen, then Bob would give Doug \$500..

So, Bob agreed to this arrangement...and he began to pray fervently every day for Kenya...nothing happened for a long time. Then, one night Bob was at a dinner in D.C. and the guests begin to share around the table what they did for a living. One lady said that she ran an orphanage in Kenya...the largest of its kind.

Suddenly, Bob began to take a great interest in the conversation...and began to ask the lady many questions about her orphanage. Finally, the lady asked Bob if he knew anyone in Kenya...he said "No!" Have you ever been to Kenya? The answer again was "No!"

Well, why are you so interested in Kenya? So, Bob told the woman that he had been praying for Kenya every day for almost 6 months. The lady asked Bob if he wanted to come to Kenya and visit the orphanage.

Bob took her up on her offer...and when he arrived he was appalled at the poverty there and the lack a basic health care. So, when Bob came back to the U.S. he began writing letters to major pharmaceutical companies...encouraging them to send to Kenya the medical supplies that they threw away every year.

Some of the pharmaceutical companies followed through on Bob's request and the next year the orphanage in Kenya received over \$1 million in medical supplies.

Of course, the lady who was in charge of the orphanage was thrilled and she called Bob and asked him to come back to Kenya for a huge celebration.

Bob flew back to Kenya and this time he had a chance to meet

the President of Kenya, who came to the celebration.

The president proceeded to take Bob on a tour of the capital city, Nairobi. During their tour they saw a prison, and Bob discovered that the prison was primarily for political prisoners. Bob told the president that this was a bad idea...that he should set these prisoners free.'

Several weeks after Bob returned to the U.S, the State Department called him and asked if he had made any statements to the president of Kenya about political prisoners. Bob said, "Yes, I told the president that he should set them free!"

Well, that's exactly what the president did...the State Dept had been working for years to have these prisoners set free...but to no avail.

Several months later, the president of Kenya called Bob and told him that he was about to make a huge reorganization of the government...and he wanted Bob to come back and pray for him for three days while he made this very important decision.

So, Bob went back to Kenya to pray for the president...

All of this happened because Bob began to pray fervently for Kenya...and he was willing to take a risk and go to Kenya and get involved.
