From the Pastor's Desk....

The Importance of Community

During worship in September, we focused on scripture related to community. Why is community so important? God loves people and he knows that people need people. He created us to live in community, giving and receiving support, which leads to generosity and gratitude. What does our community need from us?

- To reflect the heart and nature of God.
- To strive to build bridges of understanding, goodwill and mutual respect to all around us.
- To be honest, truthful, trustworthy, reliable, loyal and unselfish.
- To reach out to those who are struggling with caring words of encouragement and deeds of compassion.
- To help those who have fallen and protect those who are vulnerable.

This is not done very often in heroic acts but in the little things we can do every day along life's way.

Author, publisher, and speaker Tom Ehrich writes, "Goodness in its many forms warms a heart: kindness, generosity, self-sacrifice, mercy—in which one sees and cares for the other. The tendency of humanity to deplete—to take more than we give, to wound rather than be vulnerable, to fight for our way, to seize the larger share—is quietly counter-balanced when goodness is at hand. The man Jesus himself seems to have been a quiet doer of good. He had relatively few in his entourage, expected no acclaim, left town before hero worship could begin, amassed no power or wealth, paid no attention to the lofty, launched no institution and in the end gave everything he had, even life itself, to God's beloved. And yet, that doing of good filled the land with new life."

Catholic priest, professor, writer and theologian Henri Nouwen believed that community is best understood as a quality of the heart. He wrote, "The word, 'community,' has many connotations, some positive and some negative. Community can make us think of a safe togetherness, shared meals, common goals and joyful celebrations. It can also call forth images of sectarian exclusivity, in-group language, self-satisfied isolation and romantic naïveté.


However, community is first of all a quality of the heart. It grows from the spiritual knowledge that we are alive not for ourselves but for one another. Community is the fruit of our capacity to make the interests of others more important than our own."

Will you do your part to make your communities stronger and healthier by reflecting the heart and nature of God, which we commonly refer to as being the presence of Christ?

Jeff Cranford began serving as our interim pastor on September 3rd.



Jeff earned his M.A. and Ph.D. in Religion at Baylor University and his B.A. in Biblical Languages and Literature at Gardner-Webb University.

He has assisted the Baptist General Association of Virginia (BGAV) churches as interim pastor and transition consultant, and has taught as an adjunct professor for Averett University and John Leland Seminary.

He retired from full-time service with the BGAV on March 1, 2019. During his tenure, he served in many capacities, most recently as Central Region Field Strategist and Compensation Planning Specialist. Following retirement, Jeff began part-time service as BGAV Minister-in-Residence for Church Finances. In this capacity, he continues to assist churches with all aspects of church finances. He also leads annual seminars in church and clergy taxes, church financial administration, financial support planning for church staff, and preparing for retirement. Since 2014, he has held the Chartered Retirement Planning Counselor SM or CRPC ® designation with the College for Financial Planning.

They have a daughter, Anna Grandpre (husband Matt) who resides in Waynesboro, and has four children--Sam, Eli, Catherine, and Caroline. 

Worship – Mindy Ward, chair - reviews and evaluates the worship services with a view to enhancing and strengthening them; includes - services, bulletins, music, communion, and decorations/flowers.

Pastor-Staff-Church Relations – works with the pastor in keeping the covenant between the pastor and church up-to-date and abiding by the guidelines adopted for the relationship as noted in the covenant agreement. Serves in support of the pastor, and staff for the needs of the church.

Spiritual Education – coordinates Sunday School teachers, Bible Study leaders and Pastor-led studies, for the understanding of the Bible and spiritual growth.

Audio-Visual – Responsible for seeing to the maintenance, security and use of any audio/visual equipment owned by the church for the enhancement and broadcasting of services as appropriate. Volunteers with the knowledge and assistance of the audio/visual equipment.

Periodically, inspects the facilities for possible repairs and upgrading as well as scheduling work days for the purpose of maintaining the building and grounds. Major areas of focus are: Electricity, HVAC, General Maintenance, Facility Protection, and Cleaning Teams.

Communications and Publicity – Donna Duerson Evans, chair - Liaison between the church and the media to include: Website, Facebook, Twitter, newsletter, directory, newspapers, television, radio, etc. Updates posted information to include planned special events, services and ministries. Maintains the email distribution list of active attendees used by the pastor and those who provide information to the congregation on behalf of church leadership.

Missions and Community Outreach – Plans and promotes mission ministries with Goshen Baptist Association, Baptist General Association of Virginia, Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, and other agencies as appropriate through special emphases or direct hands-on involvement; includes coordinating and promoting the annual mission offerings, and promoting a ministry to contact and share the message of Christ and our church with the Lake Anna Community.

Hospitality– Coral Losinski, chair – Ensures kitchen has adequate supplies. Plans and coordinates church dinners and special events such as church's Anniversary/Homecoming, Valentine Fellowship, special concerts, and programs.

Caring Community – Alana Frazier, chair – Coordinates Prayer Ministry, Card Ministry, and meal coordination, when needed. Provides assistance with the selection of gifts as needed for special occasions, graduation, and recognition of special accomplishments.

Finance— Mike Bridges, chair - Responsible for church finances and other related duties. Chaired by the Treasurer (elected by the church members). Includes an assistant and others who can assist as approved by the deacons under the direction of the Treasurer.

POTLUCK! From this month's Women's GRACE Fellowship comes this scrumptious salad made even more scrumptious by replacing the craisins with yogurt raisins. Apple cider vinegar works as a good substitute for the red wine vinegar. Thank you to Katrina Northcraft for introducing this salad to our collection.

Broccoli Cauliflower Salad

Servings: 8 servings Calories: 359kcal

Ingredients

- .75 lbs Broccoli florets cut into bite sized pieces
- .75 lbs cauliflower florets cut into bite sized pieces
- 1/4 cup Red onion
- 1/4 cup Craisins
- 3 tbsp red wine vinegar
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 tbsp Sugar optional
- 1 cup sunflower seeds
- 1/2 cup crumbled bacon



Instructions

- 1. Combine the mayonnaise, vinegar, and sugar in a bowl and whisk until smooth.
- 2. In a large bowl, add the broccoli, cauliflower, onion, craisins and dressing and toss to coat.
- 3. Add the sunflower seeds and bacon and toss again gently to distribute.
- 4. Serve chilled. Enjoy!

Notes

Leftovers of Broccoli Cauliflower Salad can be stored in the fridge for up to a week.
 If possible keep the sunflower seeds and bacon separate until serving.
