A word with $\mathcal{D}ee^{\prime\prime}$

In our secular world we focus on Christmas "presents" and packages. However, as Christians our focus on this special day should be the "presence" of God in our hearts and lives.

That is the real message of Christmas: God came into this world in order to be present with us...God came into this world as a little baby born in Bethlehem...That's what the incarnation is all about:

God is present with us.

The Creator became a part of his very own creation.

Jesus came into the world to demonstrate the love of God:

Through his message

Through his miracles

Through his ministry

But primarily Jesus demonstrated his love for us by giving his life on a cross...Jesus allowed himself to be crucified on a cross so that we can have eternal life...

If you go on a tour of the Holy Land, one of the most impressive places to visit is the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem.

Roman Emperor Constantine had a church built on this very location in 330 AD in order to commemorate the exact place where Jesus was born. The truth is that this location is probably pretty accurate. Inside this huge cathedral is a cave...and in the cave is a silver star which supposedly represents the very spot on which Jesus was born.

We cannot know for sure...but there is no doubt that this loca-

tion is very close to the exact location of the birth of Jesus. The inscription on this cave reads: "To the Virgin Mary is born Jesus"

One thing that is very interesting about a journey to the Holy Land is to recognize how close Bethlehem is to Jerusalem. It is only 5 miles from Bethlehem to Jerusalem.

Therefore, the place where Jesus was born is only 7 miles from Golgotha...the place where Jesus was crucified.

This means that the distance from the cradle to the cross is about the same distance as it is from the RuraLove Ministry Center to the town of Louisa. The two most important events in all of history (the birth and death of Jesus) took place only 7 miles apart.

This truth reminds us that Jesus was born to die. The primary purpose of his arrival in the world was for Jesus to be nailed to a cross and take the sins of the world upon himself on that cross.

That means that we can have eternal life (a personal relationship with Almighty God) because Jesus has taken away the punishment for our sins.

That is the greatest Christmas present of all time...

That is the reason that we need to celebrate on this very special occasion. ~ Dee
