



Meet Our New Pastor



Rev. Michael Gray

After an extensive search of many months, our Pastor Search Committee notified the congregation that they had narrowed down their search to one candidate – Rev. Michael Gray. A Call Weekend was held on October 28th & 29th that included a Meet and Greet with the church leadership and a Meet the Pastor session for the congregation during which time Rev. Gray introduced himself, and his wife, Cathy, and answered questions posed prior to the session. The day ended with a pizza social where everyone could get to know each other a little better in a relaxed atmosphere. On Sunday, Rev. Gray led a combined service after which

a special called business meeting was held and, by secret ballot, the members present voted unanimously to call Rev. Gray as our next pastor.

Rev. Michael Gray was born in Panama City, Florida. He grew up in an Air Force family, so has lived all over the world, most notably St. Petersburg, Florida where he met his wife, Cathy. He was called to the ministry in 1972,



holds a Master of Divinity from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (Louisville, KY), and has served churches in Florida, Virginia, Kentucky, and Indiana. From 1973-1975, he was also a participant in the TV ministry, "A Man & His Boys", with Dr. Jess Moody. He most recently served as Interim Pastor of White Stone Baptist Church, White Stone, VA.

Rev. Gray has been married since 1973 to Cathy Lee Graefe. They have two daughters, Lara Capps and Kristen Hamill, and five grandchildren. His hobbies include kayaking, walking, fishing, hiking, and reading.

Cathy was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and grew up in St. Petersburg, Florida. She worked over 39 years in the dental field (front office) in Washington, DC and Newport News, Virginia. Her hobbies include her grandchildren, reading, walking, music (singing and praising God), going to the beach and enjoying the sunshine, and Hallmark movies. She loves serving others, and is looking forward to finding new opportunities to serve both Elk Creek Baptist Church and in the community.

A special thanks to Dee Whitten and Jeff Cranford who provided guidance to our pastor search committee.




Comings and Goings -

The damage next to the door to Duerson Hall is also on tap to be repaired.

At the same time, a new sidewalk has been laid leading up to Duerson Hall, a combination lock has been added to the door, and the dead trees at the waterfront are being removed in preparation to plant trees to reduce the road noise. One of the small rooms at the rear of Duerson Hall is being converted into an office for the pastor.

Worship – Mindy Ward, chair - reviews and evaluates the worship services with a view to enhancing and strengthening them; includes - services, bulletins, music, communion, and decorations/flowers.

Pastor-Staff-Church Relations – works with the pastor in keeping the covenant between the pastor and church up-to-date and abiding by the guidelines adopted for the relationship as noted in the covenant agreement. Serves in support of the pastor, and staff for the needs of the church.

Spiritual Education – coordinates Sunday School teachers, Bible Study leaders and Pastor-led studies, for the understanding of the Bible and spiritual growth.

Audio-Visual – Responsible for seeing to the maintenance, security and use of any audio/visual equipment owned by the church for the enhancement and broadcasting of services as appropriate. Volunteers with the knowledge and assistance of the audio/visual equipment.

Building and Grounds – Jay Canova, chair - Responsible for the cleanliness, maintenance, security and beautification of the church's building and grounds including the Lakefront Worship area. Periodically, inspects the facilities for possible repairs and upgrading as well as scheduling work days for the purpose of maintaining the building and grounds. Major areas of focus are: Electricity, HVAC, General Maintenance, Facility Protection, and Cleaning Teams.

Communications and Publicity – Donna Duerson Evans, chair - Liaison between the church and the media to include: Website, Facebook, Twitter, newsletter, directory, newspapers, television, radio, etc. Updates posted information to include planned special events, services and ministries. Maintains the email distribution list of active attendees used by the pastor and those who provide information to the congregation on behalf of church leadership.

Missions and Community Outreach – Plans and promotes mission ministries with Goshen Baptist Association, Baptist General Association of Virginia, Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, and other agencies as appropriate through special emphases or direct hands-on involvement; includes coordinating and promoting the annual mission offerings, and promoting a ministry to contact and share the message of Christ and our church with the Lake Anna Community.

Hospitality– Coral Losinski, chair – Ensures kitchen has adequate supplies. Plans and coordinates church dinners and special events such as church's Anniversary/Homecoming, Valentine Fellowship, special concerts, and programs.

Caring Community – Alana Frazier, chair – Coordinates Prayer Ministry, Card Ministry, and meal coordination, when needed. Provides assistance with the selection of gifts as needed for special occasions, graduation, and recognition of special accomplishments.

Finance— Mike Bridges, chair - Responsible for church finances and other related duties. Chaired by the Treasurer (elected by the church members). Includes an assistant and others who can assist as approved by the deacons under the direction of the Treasurer.


