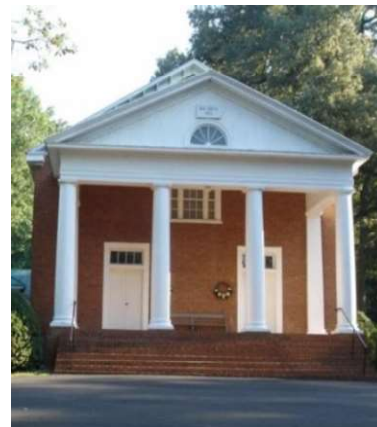

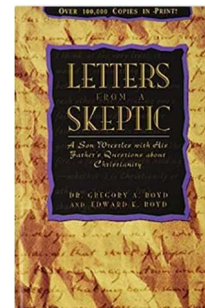

**POTLUCK!** Here is a throw back to days of Christmas past when a celebration was not complete without a Jello mold salad. I still count dinner a success when the mold comes out in one piece.

#### Ingredients

- 1 large (8.5 serving) box of Raspberry gelatin (or 2 3 oz boxes)
- 2 cups boiling water
- ½ cup pecans, chopped into small chunks  
(use more if you especially like nuts – I usually do)
- ½ cup celery, chopped into small chunks
- 1 12 oz package of fresh cranberries
- 1 navel orange
- 1 cup granulated sugar

#### Directions

1. Grind together the cranberries and orange.
2. Add the sugar and mix together until sugar is dissolved.
3. Add the nuts and celery, mix well and set aside
4. In a large bowl, dissolve the jello in 2 cups of boiling water.
5. Add 1 ½ cups of cold water to jello, mixing well
6. Pour jello into cranberry mixture, mix well and set in refrigerator to chill.
7. When ready to serve, with a fork, stir cranberry jello salad around with a fork, breaking up the jello.
8. Or, if using a mold, lightly spray mold, pour mixture into mold and set in refrigerator to chill.

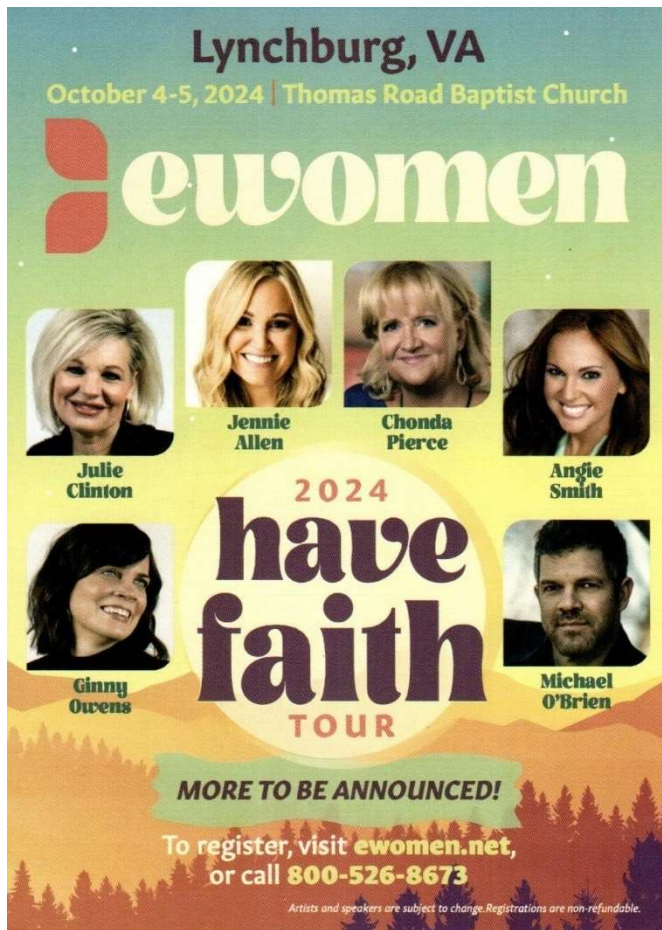
