

Thoughts about Truth: Words for Encouragement

In this very political year, accusations and lies are flying about us. People wonder who and what they can believe in. Don't be surprised; the Bible told us this would happen in the end times. For a short refresher, check out: Matthew 24; 1 Timothy 4:1-5; 2 Timothy 3:1-5; 2 Peter 3.

False teachings, false messiahs, masquerades, and lies are all around us. They are part of the end times. In Revelation, it paints a picture of people amidst the confusion, chaos and destruction that lies bring, looking for anyone who can bring what is thought to be order, peace and prosperity. Today, you don't have to look far to bear someone claim they will save you, our nation and the world. The

There is only one Savior, and His name is Jesus. This calls for faith. The scriptures warn of false teachers in 2 Peter 2, false messiahs in 1 John 2, and a spirit of falsehood in 1 John 4. Revelation 13 speaks of an unholy three (Satan, Antichrist, False Prophet) who will lie to manipulate people and bring in one world order. The Bible rightfully calls Christians to be alert, be ready, and test the spirits.

So, where do we find truth to comfort, encourage and give hope, for strong faith? We trust in the Word of God that tells us in Hebrews 6:18, "...it is impossible for God to lie". He always and only tells the truth! Verse :19 follows with: "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure."

Jesus said in John 14:6: "I am the way, the truth, and the life...". 1 John 5:20 calls Jesus, "Him who is true" and "the true God." Revelation 19:11 says when Jesus returns, He will be called "Faithful and True." For discerning truth, we turn to Jesus and His Word, the Bible.

The Bible is divinely inspired truth from God for faith. It is "God breathed," 2 Timothy 3:16. "No prophecy of scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation. For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit," 2 Peter 1:20-21.

God speaks only truth, and His Word is inspired truth, providing certainty, and confidence for faith. Don't let the times in which we live discourage you or bring doubt. Nothing that is happening is a surprise to God, and He has a plan. God's Word will help you through each daily news cycle and give hope for tomorrow.

We are facing many uncertainties about people and the future in this year, but in God we trust, in Jesus we believe, and in His Word we find truth to live faithfully day by day.

As Paul said to his protégé, "...as for you, continue in what you have learned and become convinced of..." 2 Tim. 3:14. And as 2 Peter 3: 11, 14 says about looking forward to Jesus' return: "...live holy and godly lives... make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at peace with Him." Truth for today and tomorrow.




