

# The Color and Temperature of Faith

It's October when we have some hot, some cold, and warm in between. The leaves are changing and falling down as the political rhetoric goes up. In the natural beauty of this season, it can be a time of reflection, seeing the beauty of God's grace at work in your life, and asking, is truth prevailing? What about your life is changing, falling or going upward?

Fall is a season where God shows off His creativity in nature among the hardwoods. Autum is "awwwetum". The colors, though different from spring, have their own beauty with the reds, yellows, oranges, rust and brown, interspersed. Between the spring and fall seasons we get to see the color palate of God's creation among the trees and flowers before the beauty of the white snow filled countryside arrives in winter. Then the evergreens stand out in contrast to the snow, as if saying, "In Christ life goes on eternally". Amen.

What color is your faith? Is it bright or dull? To put it in a different perspective, as Miss Clara asked in the movie, War Room, about your relationship to Jesus, "is your life hot, cold or lukewarm"? She was quoting from Jesus' letter to the church in Laodicea in Revelation 3:15-16. "I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either one or the other! So, because you are lukewarm—neither hot nor cold—I am about to spit you out of my mouth."

One thing that can make the color of our life of faith dull or lukewarm is fear. It dulls our life in commitment and can paralyze us from taking a stand for Jesus. My October sermons will deal with fear from Biblical truth. God's word teaches a reverent fear in the perspective of faith, assurance and "the peace that passes all understanding" in Christ Jesus. God's word enlightens and encourages!

Our world's infatuation with horror, doom, darkness, gore, evil, and death, reflects a different message in temperature and color.



Here is the good news. The same letter to the church in Laodicea that challenges a lukewarm or dull faith has this message in 3:20. "Here I am! I stand at the door and

knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me." Jesus is offering a full and joyful, eternal and personal, relationship of faith.

While God's Word acknowledges and warns of doom and evil in the end times, it provides all we need to live faithfully. I invite you to the Wednesday Bible Study of 1 & 2

Peter, *Living in the End Times*, and the Book Study, *Experiencing God*, that teaches God is always at work around us and inviting us to partner in doing His will. No screams of horror for Christians. Instead, we listen for the shout of Jesus' return for His Church. In that reality, we can live in triumph and victory!

May the beauty of the Fall Season re-fire your faith,



## 4<sup>th</sup> Elk Creek Blood Drive: 14 Jan 12:00 to 6:00 PM


Our 4<sup>th</sup> blood drive is around the corner. To date, we've donated 94 units, with 24% of those donations being first time donors. If you are a regular donor, there is a 60 day wait time between donations, so please plan accordingly.

Red cross is always in need of blood with a critical need now for O, A and B negative blood types. Your donation saves countless lives with a typical unit of blood impacting three people. Our drive provides an opportunity to donate blood, or red blood cells (a power red donation). More info on that below.

STEPS for signing up:

- 1. Go to redcrossblood.org
- 2. Enter 23024 in "find a blood drive". Click blue arrow
- 3. Select "By Distance" tab
- 4. Select "See Times" next to Elk Creek Baptist Church





5. Choose your time. "Blood" is a traditional donation. "Power Red" is similar to a whole blood donation, except a special machine is used to allow you to safely donate two units of red blood cells during one donation while returning your plasma and platelets to you. It takes about 30 minutes longer than a normal donation and you must weigh more than 150 lbs.

6. Then you either sign in, or create an account if you haven't done this before. The steps are straight forward.
