The **Quarterly Business Meeting** was held October 13th in which the various Stewardship leaders gave a report of their input to the budget for the upcoming year. It was noted that the monthly fund drives that are monetary donations have been incorporated into the budget so will no longer appear as a monthly "Mission Project". Persons interested in giving to a particular mission may designate such at any time and it will be included as an offering.

The highlight of the meeting was the election of four new deacons – (I-r) Wayne Frazier, Clorese Vaughan, Bobby Jones, and Tony Wilson. With their election, begins classes of deacons who will serve for three years, then rotate out for a period of at least one year before being eligible for re-nomination as a deacon. To better serve the congregation, the deacons will be focusing primarily on pastoral care. Over time, with congregational input and approval, an administrative council of elected leaders will be established to deal with the business needs of the church.









Buildings and Grounds provided an update on the upgrades of the church. Sealing of the remaining outer walls of the church has taken place and the outdoor sanctuary parking area has been asphalted and lined.





The theme was The Hands of Christ: growing,


serving, cooperating. Following the business part of the meeting, the Elk Creek Band sang two songs. And in

4th Elk Creek Blood Drive: 14 Jan 12:00 to 6:00 PM


Our 4th blood drive is around the corner. To date, we've donated 94 units, with 24% of those donations being first time donors. If you are a regular donor, there is a 60 day wait time between donations, so please plan accordingly.

Red cross is always in need of blood with a critical need now for O, A and B negative blood types. Your donation saves countless lives with a typical unit of blood impacting three people. Our drive provides an opportunity to donate blood, or red blood cells (a power red donation). More info on that below.

STEPS for signing up:

- Go to redcrossblood.org
- 2. Enter 23024 in "find a blood drive". Click blue arrow
- 3. Select "By Distance" tab
- 4. Select "See Times" next to Elk Creek Baptist Church





5. Choose your time. "Blood" is a traditional donation. "Power Red" is similar to a whole blood donation, except a special machine is used to allow you to safely donate two units of red blood cells during one donation while returning your plasma and platelets to you. It takes about 30 minutes longer than a normal donation and you must weigh more than 150 lbs.

6. Then you either sign in, or create an account if you haven't done this before. The steps are straight forward.
